Plaintiff has requested authority under 28 U.S.C. § 1915 to proceed in forma pauperis. Plaintiff has submitted the affidavit required by § 1915(a) showing that plaintiff is unable to prepay fees and costs or give security for them. Accordingly, the request to proceed in forma pauperis will be granted. In accordance with the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

2. The Clerk of the Court is directed to issue process and to serve upon plaintiff the

security cases. 3. The Clerk of the Court is further directed to serve a copy of this order upon the United States Marshal. 4. Within fourteen (14) days from the date of this order, plaintiff shall submit to the United States Marshal a completed summons, a completed USM-285 form, sufficient copies of the summons and complaint for service of process in accordance with Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(i), and sufficient copies of the Scheduling Order and Order re Consent or Request for Reassignment issued in this case. Information regarding the number of copies currently required by the United States Marshal may be obtained from the United States Marshals Service, 501 I Street, Suite 5600, Sacramento, CA 95814 (tel. 916-930-2030). 5. Within five (5) days after submitting the necessary documents to the United States Marshal for service or process, plaintiff shall file in this court a declaration stating the date on which the documents were submitted to the United States Marshal. Failure to file a timely declaration may result in an order imposing appropriate sanctions. 6. The United States Marshal is directed to serve proces Scheduling Order and Order re Consent or Request for Reassignment without prepayment of

costs not later than sixty (60) days from the date of this order. Service of process shall be completed by delivering all necessary documents to the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of

California and by sending copies of the summons, complaint and court orders by registered or certified mail to the Attorney General of the United States at Washington, D.C. See FED. R. CIV.
