## ORDER

THIS MATTER is before the court on the Plaintiffs' Notice of Filing Affidavit of Attorneys' Fees (Doc. 114). Defendants didnot any responsive pleading directed to this affidavit.

Previously, this court entered an Order (Doc. 107) imposingsanctions against Defendant Joy C. Kovar pursuant to Rule 37 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure for her deliberatenonappearance at her deposition scheduled for June 17, 2005. Assanctions, the court awarded Plaintiffs reasonable attorney'sfees and costs associated with the deposition and the motion forcontempt, and the court directed counsel to submit an affidavitof fees and costs. See id.

In response, Solomon Tropp filed an affidavit (Doc. 114-2)setting forth its attorneys' and paralegal's hours expended, hourly rates charged, and the total amount billed. According toits statement, the firm expended a total of 17.10 hours for atotal amount of \$5,724.00. However, counsel failed to submit anitemized billing statement that specifies the nature of the work performed and the time expended for such work in amanner that would allow the court to determine the reasonablenessof the request. In awarding attorney's fees, the primary factorsto consider are the time expended and the hourly rate. Andrewsv. United States, 122 F.3d 1367, 1375 (11th Cir. 1997) ("Thestarting point for determining a reasonable fee award ismultiplying the number of attorney hours reasonably expended by areasonable hourly rate."). Based on this court's own experience and the fact that somediscovery was taken, the court concludes that the hours expendedare somewhat excessive as are the hourly rates for this typework. Therefore, in its discretion, the court finds that\$3,000.00 constitutes a reasonable attorney's fee and appropriatesanction associated with the deposition in question. Plaintiffs'counsel is awarded this amount. The costs in the amount of\$225.00 for Kanabay Court Reporters' services is reasonable and is also awarded.

Defendant Joy C. Kovar is directed to pay \$3,225.00 to TheSolomon Tropp Law Group, P.A., 400 North Ashley Plaza, Suite3000, Tampa, Florida, 33602-4331, within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order. Failure to do so may result in furthercontempt findings against Ms. Kovar.
