1. Brief Summary of Proceedings: On December 20, 2013, the

Forest Service withdrew the Decision Notice and Finding of No Significant Impact for the Porcupine Vegetation and Road Management Project. ECF No. 18-1. On January 8, 2014, the Court stayed the proceedings and vacated all deadlines in the case so that the parties could resolve the case without judicial involvement. ECF No. 19. The Court requested that the parties submit a Joint Status Report on or before January 29, 2014. Id. 2. Status of Negotiations: The parties have been actively

discussing a resolution of the case without judicial involvement, and believe that they may be able to reach an agreement. The parties respectfully request an additional two weeks to discuss the details of a potential agreement resolving the case.
